



Study periods

Sixth Form is **full time**. (There is time for around 10 hours of part time work). 27 hours/3 subjects or 36 hours/4 subjects per fortnight

If you were spending significantly less than the British average of 36.6 hours a week on your school work, research for higher education and enrichment, it could raise interesting questions...

Previous successes doesn't automatically guarantee it for the future

Research suggests students who achieve A grades do 20 hours of **independent** study a week across 4 subjects/areas.

WHY?

1. Positive correlation between success and attendance
 - 95-100% - Better than average progress
 - 50-80% - 1 grade lower in 2 out of 3 subjects
 - Lower 50% - 1 grade or more lower than average in ALL subjects
 2. Lower attendance correlates with more questions missed in exams
 3. Friendships
- Plus many more.....


