The APDR cycle

We have now completed our first cycle of Assess, Plan, Do, Review (The APDR cycle). This is to formalise and develop a system that we were already using. Teachers have fed back on the outcomes set in September for each student on the SEND register. We are currently reviewing these, ensuring they are ready to report to parents and carers. As you can imagine, with over 140 students on the SEND register and 10 sets of comments per teacher, this is a huge job. Mr Middleton, our SENDCo, and his team have been working incredibly hard to complete this. He expects to get these out to you before Christmas as part of each student's SEND plan. There will be an opportunity to comment on the process and the information received by completing an attached Google form. We always welcome constructive feedback on where we can improve, as well as what we are doing well. Positive feedback is always a welcome boost to the team. Thank you to the parents and carers who have already taken the time to do this.
